7X7X7: 7am, 7pm, 7 words: "Lord, please stop abortion in this country."

Kansas enacted HB-2313 requiring an infant born after a botched abortion to be given every professional care possible to save the child's life including the child be immediately transferred to a hospital. This law was enacted even though Kansas's pro-abortion governor had vetoed it. Fifty colleagues co-sponsored the law called the Born Alive Infant Protection Act. The state representative who sponsored the bill was a doctor and had witnessed a baby being born alive after a botched abortion. Since the US does not record the number of babies who survive abortions, Canadian government extrapolations have estimated 1.734 babies have survived abortions every year in the U.S. The state representative encourages other states to sponsor such a -Life Advocacy Oct 23, 2023 bill.

Be Watchful! Be Alert!

Today we begin the beautiful and holy season of Advent. With all that we have going on this time of year, it's no wonder Advent that does not always seem to get the attention it deserves. But if we will commit to living this season well, we will experience a deeper conversion to Christ and find real transformation in our lives as Christian stewards.
